25th Anniversary flashback:

NAV's 25th Anniversary was held on 3rd April 2022, participation by Ministers, Victorian Multicultural Commissioners, DHHS staffs, Multicultural Community and Business Leaders, and Nepalese Community Leaders within Victoria an example of our mutual support and mutual interests. NAV 25th Anniversary souvenir booklet was exposited on day of celebration by The Hon. Ros Spence (Minister for Multicultural Affairs). It has information and highlights of NAV's achievements and history since it officially established in the year of 1997 however, it is to be noted NAV was unofficially established in the year of 1993. The booklet is the result of hard-work and celebration of all Nepalese and Multicultural of Victoria. It contains personalized messages from Australian Prime Minister, Premier of Victoria, Leader of Opposition, Ministers, VMC, Embassy of Nepal, Consulate General of Nepal to Victoria, all other valuable Community Leaders and all our valuable community business leaders in Victoria.

NAV'S History: The Nepalese Association of Victoria has completed 25 years of its establishment, a rare milestone achievement for any communities' organizations. The journey of 25 years conveys the history of Nepali community settlement in Victoria and their

contributions. The name Nepalese Association of Victoria was endorsed after discussion with prominent community members of the Nepali community at the time, from its initial proposed name 'Nepalese/Gurkha Community' in a meeting held on June 19, 1994. The community's desire to make an inclusive organization to represent all people of Nepali descent living in Victoria was the primary reason for agreeing to the above name.

The main objective of the organization identified was to unite and work for the community wellbeing and promote our cultural diversity for the benefit of all Nepalis living in Victoria. It decided to do so by organizing meetings of Nepalis and take necessary action to address their problems. The meeting also outlined the rules and regulations for the organization. It was decided that to become member of the organization, a person should have resided in Victoria for at least three months with legal visa status of residency and or citizenship. You will be able to receive more information on NAV's official website.

Volunteer Recognition: We are extremely lucky to have great numbers of volunteers to help NAV reach its goal. Our volunteers spent their dedicated time and energy distributing food relief packages to those in need. We were able to reach the wider parts of Victoria such as Ballarat, Bendigo and Shepperton because of them. We were also able to work along with other Multicultural organizations during these hard times. These joint efforts strengthen NAV and other organizations as we appreciate the inputs that different sources bring to our organization and with wider involvement, we increase the impact of our efforts.

Having volunteers participating in varieties of sports events and awareness program such as covid information session and mental health made a huge impact. They have been recognized and appreciated especially in our 25th Anniversary where we delivered a "certificate of appreciation and token of love" for their tremendous support.

Summary: In the past 2 years, we had some members leave and some join the organization in NAV. As some members who had decided to leave the organization, were not able cope with the pressure and the expectation that comes with working in NAV. This resulted in taking a bit of time for me to fill this void within the team. Although I felt a bit of pressure in that setback. In my opinion, this is understandable as it is important to note, NAV is a voluntary organization and people do have other priorities. Majority of members joined NAV to gain opportunities and learn and I hope they were able to attain what they expected from NAV. Despite the hindrance, we worked hard and with the support of Victorian Government's grant approved, we were able to go through many projects and came out successful.

Overall, I would like to mention it has been an honour to have been given the opportunity to serve as the president for NAV 2020-2022. 
